Environmental Regulations

Electronic Equipment contains materials known to be hazardous and a threat to the environment, including: batteries, lead, mercury, cadmium and other metals.

Environmental Regulations, con't.

- Proper management of such material is regulated under RCRA (Resource Conservation and Recovery Act).
- Under RCRA, businesses and others are obligated to recognize and properly manage regulated materials.

TCO – Total Cost of Ownership

To purchase and maintain a computer on a desktop for three years, the total cost of ownership three years ago was reported to be \$15,000. These costs include desktop installation, software, upgrades, training, helpdesk support, asset management, IT management and other miscellaneous expenses.

Total Cost of Disposal

- Total cost of proper disposal = \$25.00 or less or *less than 1% of the TCO*.
- Budget ahead, at time of procurement.
- Disposal is an under-rated and unappreciated aspect of proper and controlled asset management.

- Privacy Sensitive and proprietary info on hard drives and other media including data on thermal transfer on fax/printer cartridges.
- Asset Tags Equipment origin is traceable.

Not all electronics recyclers are created equal Protect yourself and your organization Do your due diligence. Ensure your program is meeting appropriate environmental standards. Don't select your recycler based on their website alone. Anyone can put up a web-site. What is behind it? VISIT your asset management/recycling company to see how they are managing your equipment. ASK QUESTIONS!

Procuring Recycling Services

When writing an RFP for IT management systems, or desktop replacement programs, develop specifications and incorporate your requirements for disposal into contracts to ensure proper handling.

- Are the hard drives scrubbed and how?
- Are Asset Tags removed?
- Are hazardous components such as batteries, mercury switches and capacitors identified, removed, and managed properly?

How is your material handled? (con't.)

- Is there management system in place?
- Is anything being landfilled or incinerated, and if so, what volume?
- Is your equipment being exported to Pacific Rim countries or Africa?

- Do they have adequate insurance coverage?
- Do they have a written environmental policy?
- Have you checked their credit rating?
- Do they have references?

Does the recycler offer a resale program?

- Is there a revenue share program?
- What are the revenue share terms?
- Which resale markets are being used? Domestic, foreign or both?
- How are the buyers "qualified"?
- How are the sales tracked?

Resale Caution!

Stories abound of electronics being resold on E-bay, at computer shows and through other venues with proprietary data still intact. Be sure to audit your recycler's procedures for removing *your data* prior to resale!

(Freedom Best Practices, con't.)

- Haz mat identification, removal and proper management
- Data erasure and asset tag removal
- Revenue sharing sales program
- Turn-key logistics support

Studies have shown

- Donation programs simply shift the problem to others and are no longer effective
- Redeployment/cascading is often more costly than purchasing new equipment
- Sales programs are costly to administer and can lead to privacy and software licensing issues
